Title: I was so Jealous, until...

Text: Psalms 73:1-28

The Crisis of Faith

¹ Truly God is good to Israel, to those whose hearts are pure. ² But as for me, I almost lost my footing. My feet were slipping, and I was almost gone. ³ For I envied the proud when I saw them prosper despite their wickedness. ⁴ They seem to live such painless lives; their bodies are so healthy and strong. ⁵ They don't have troubles like other people; they're not plagued with problems like everyone else. They wear pride like a jeweled necklace and clothe themselves with cruelty. ⁷ These fat cats have everything their hearts could ever wish for! ⁸ They scoff and speak only evil; in their pride they seek to crush others. ⁹ They boast against the very heavens, and their words strut throughout the earth. ¹⁰ And so the people are dismayed and confused, drinking in all their words. ¹¹ "What does God know?" they ask. "Does the Most High even know what's happening?" ¹² Look at these wicked people—enjoying a life of ease while their riches multiply.

The Turning Point of Faith

¹³ *Did I keep my heart pure for nothing?* Did I keep myself innocent for no reason? ¹⁴ I get nothing but trouble all day long; every morning brings me pain. ¹⁵ *If I had really spoken this way to others, I would have been a traitor to your people.* ¹⁶ So I tried to understand why the wicked prosper. But what a difficult task it is! ¹⁷ Then *I went into*

your sanctuary, O God, and I finally understood the destiny of the wicked.

The Resolution of Faith

¹⁸ Truly, you put them <u>on a slippery path</u> and send them sliding over the cliff to destruction. ¹⁹ In an instant they are destroyed, completely swept away by terrors. ²⁰ When you arise, O Lord, you will laugh at their silly ideas as a person laughs at dreams in the morning. ²¹ Then I realized that my heart was bitter, and I was all torn up inside. ²² I was so foolish and ignorant— I must have seemed like a senseless animal to you. ²³ Yet I still belong to you; you hold my right hand. ²⁴ You guide me with your counsel, leading me to a glorious destiny. ²⁵ Whom have I in heaven but you? I desire you more than anything on earth. ²⁶ My health may fail, and my spirit may grow weak, but God remains the strength of my heart; he is mine forever. ²⁷ Those who desert him will perish, for you destroy those who abandon you. ²⁸ But as for me, how good it is to be near God! I have made the Sovereign LORD my shelter, and I will tell everyone about the wonderful things you do.

- I. Why we get in Crisis (Sometimes) (v. 1-12)
 - a. Challenges arise in our lives and we begin to question the goodness of God.
 - (v.1 God is good ... to those whose heart are pure...)
 - b. We judge ourselves in comparison to others who do not honor or respect God.
 - (v.3 For <u>I envied</u> the proud when I saw them prosper... despite their wickedness)
 - **Prov. 14:30 NLT** A peaceful heart leads to a healthy body; jealousy (envy) is like cancer in the bones.

Envied – jealous, **to get heated**, become excited, to annoy, to be in torment, to rebel

- The premise we live with is that prosperity should be the fruit of the righteous, not the wicked.
- Theologically, we believe that prosperity is the guarantee to the righteous (v. Psalms 1:3 NLT they shall be like the tree planted ... and they shall prosper in all they do)

-The prosperity of the wicked is outlined by the Psalmist

- v. 4 They seem to be healthy. They seem to know no pain
- v. 5 They seem to be trouble free; the day to day problems that plague most people seem to be unknown to them
- v. 6 They are wealthy; they seem to make money and wear the finest jewels and clothes
- v. 7 They are "fat cats" and seem to have everything their heart desires.
- v. 7 They are arrogant and its demonstrated in how they treat other people (with cruelty).
- v. 8-12 They boast, disdain God and seem to live a life of ease.

The Psalmist crisis is simply this... "THIS IS NOT THE WAY IT'S SUPPOSE TO BE!"

POINT #1: Things are RARELY the way they seem!

- Front side: You never know anyone's pain completely
 - "All the glitters IS not Gold!"
 - "The Grass is always greener on the other side of the fence" (but the water bill is higher)!
- Flip side: God is blessing them, even when they don't recognize it.
 - God is good to all, even the unrighteous that's just the way He is!
 - Matt. 5:43-48 NLT This passage tells us something about Father God!
 - 43) "You have heard the law that says, 'Love your neighbor' and hate your enemy. 44) But I say, love your enemies! Pray for those who persecute you! 45) In that way, you will be acting as true children of your Father in heaven. For he

gives his sunlight to both the evil and the good, and he sends rain on the just and the unjust alike. 46) If you love only those who love you, what reward is there for that? Even corrupt tax collectors do that much. 47) If you are kind only to your friends, how are you different from anyone else? Even pagans do that. 48) But you are to be perfect, even as your Father in heaven is perfect. (In your love toward unrighteous people)

II. When Our Faith Turns (Turning Point) (v. 13-17)

- a. When we settle in our hearts that faith in God (his way) is never in vain.
 - v.13 Did I keep my heart pure for nothing ...
 this brutal honesty is permitted, it is the depth of a question that can be the turning point in times of crisis.
- b. Some things you can only get right, in the presence of God (right perspective on matters of life and godliness)
 - v. 17 Then I went into your sanctuary, O God, and I finally understood
 - Things you get in His presence...
 - o You get understanding
 - You get joy
 Psalms 16:11 ESV You make known to me
 the path of life; in your presence there is
 fullness of joy; at your right hand are
 pleasures forevermore.
 - You sense He is near and truth
 Psalms 145:18 ESV The Lord is near to all who call on him, to all who call on him in truth.
 - You get refreshed
 Acts 3:20 ESV "That times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord..."

POINT #2: <u>His Presence will ALWAYS change your</u> perspective!

III. When we Resolve the Crisis (Resolution)

- a. About the wicked or unrighteous (they are on a slippery path) v. 18
 - i. The heart of God is always for their repentance; that's God's business!
 - It is not wise to compare yourself with others in the journey of life – 2 Cor. 10:12
 - Mind your own business 1 Thess. 4:11 12

b. Repent and Resolve (Faith Resolution)

i. Read it as a Confession of Faith – Psalm 73:21-26, 28

²¹ Then I realized that my heart was bitter, and I was all torn up inside. ²² I was so foolish and ignorant— I must have seemed like a senseless animal to you. ²³ Yet I still belong to you; you hold my right hand. ²⁴ You guide me with your counsel, leading me to a glorious destiny. ²⁵ Whom have I in heaven but you? I desire you more than anything on earth. ²⁶ My health may fail, and my spirit may grow weak, but God remains the strength of my heart; he is mine forever.

I was so jealous, until ...

- I recognized that my situation has nothing to do with what God is doing with others ... he will guide me with His counsel, He will lead me to a glorious destiny! (v. 24)
- I realized that I had nothing to be jealous about God remains the strength of my heart; he is mine forever! (v. 26)

POINT #3: When you belong to Him, you are ALWAYS on SOLID GROUND!

Final Thought: In good times and bad, Be Confident in God's Plan for you!

²⁸ But as for me, how good it is to be near God! I have made the Sovereign Lord my shelter, and I will tell everyone about the wonderful things you do.
